


# Academic Scholarship

#### Senior School

#### Sixth Form

- · Preparation support for admissions tests, applications and interviews for universities and competitive courses.
- · Access to an academic mentor or community member, with support tailored to each scholar's chosen field.
- Additional enrichment through our Oxbridge and competitive courses programme.
- Super-curricular opportunities: essay competitions, debates, and challenge events.
- The chance to complete the Extended Project Qualification, which is equivalent to half an A Level.

#### Summary Information

What does Lingfield look for in a potential Scholar?

Academic Scholarships are awarded to students who demonstrate academic excellence, intellectual curiosity, and a genuine commitment to learning. We are looking for individuals who are eager to explore ideas, solve problems, think independently, and contribute actively to school life. Scholars are expected to act as role models within the academic community and participate fully in co-curricular opportunities.

16+ Applicants should:

- Show strong academic potential and a dedicated work ethic.
- Demonstrate subject-specific strengths and readiness for advanced study (A Level or BTEC). Applicants are generally expected to be aiming for top grades in their intended subjects or closely related fields.
- Display curiosity, independence of thought, and a clear commitment to excellence.

How do I apply?

All candidates must complete an online application form via our website by the published deadline.

16+ entry is open to:

- Lingfield students who do not currently hold an Academic Scholarship
- Academic Award holders (Awards do not continue into Sixth Form)
- External applicants joining Year 12

Current Academic Scholars automatically continue and do not need to reapply.

All Sixth Form applicants must also submit a short written statement outlining their academic interests, motivation, and up to five intended A Level or BTEC subject choices.

What is involved in the selection process?

Our selection process is designed to identify not only academic excellence but also the personal qualities that make an exceptional scholar.

#### For II+ / I3+ Entry

Candidates will be invited to an assessment day where they will complete three papers:

- Advanced Mathematics (30 minutes)
- Advanced English Comprehension (45 minutes)
- Creative Writing (30 minutes)

These assessments allow us to see how candidates think, structure ideas, and tackle challenging tasks under timed conditions.

#### For I6+ Entry

Shortlisted candidates are invited to an interview and asked to deliver a 5–7 minute presentation on an academic topic linked to one of their intended Sixth Form subjects. Visual aids (including PowerPoint) are not permitted. The discussion that follows explores subject knowledge, independent thinking, and intellectual curiosity.

What is the financial value of the scholarship?

Academic Scholarships offer a 20% tuition fee remission for Year 7 and Year 9 entry. Sixth-form academic Scholarships offer a 30% fee remission. In some cases, an Award may be offered (not Sixth Form) in recognition of potential; this carries a 10% remission.

Successful Scholarship applicants who require additional financial support may apply for Means-Tested Financial Assistance. In addition, Lingfield is committed to widening access through its Bursary Fund, which provides transformational opportunities for students who would not otherwise be able to benefit from a Lingfield education.

# Art Scholarship

Our Art department is a vibrant, inspirational, and creative environment. The aim is to encourage students to develop their individuality and potential and realise their full artistic ambition.

At Lingfield, Art is about exploration and discovery. Students are encouraged to experiment, take risks, and develop the confidence to express their own ideas. For Scholars, this means not only producing ambitious and original work but also inspiring others through their creativity and commitment.

We look for students with strong artistic ability, but more importantly, the curiosity to try new approaches and the resilience to refine their work through practice and critique. Scholars are expected to contribute to the wider artistic life of the School, support exhibitions and clubs, and act as role models for younger students.

The department is led by the Head of Art, supported by two specialist Art teachers and an Art Technician. Facilities include three dedicated art studios, a dark room for photography, and a kiln for ceramics, allowing students to explore techniques ranging from traditional painting and drawing to ceramics, printmaking, and digital media.

Each year, students showcase their work in the annual Art Exhibition and the Box Gallery, where Scholars regularly display their projects to the wider school community. They also benefit from Art open studio sessions, enrichment workshops, and, at Sixth Form, portfolio preparation for Art Foundation or degree courses.

What does Lingfield look for in a potential Scholar?	We are looking for students with exceptional creative ability - but above all, we seek the right kind of artist for our community. Candidates are assessed not only on technical skill but also on originality, risk-taking, and their ability to communicate ideas visually. At Lingfield, our pursuit of artistic excellence always begins with the person first.	
How do I apply?	All candidates must submit an online application form, available via our website, by the published deadline.  This must be accompanied by a reference from an Art Teacher, Art Club Leader, Form Teacher or any other unrelated adult who is qualified to comment on the student's artistic ability. The reference should provide insight into the student's strengths, interests, enthusiasm and progress.  Portfolio Submission Requirements:  All candidates must submit a portfolio of recent artwork. There is no prescription regarding its contents, a strong portfolio is likely to include work based on direct observation and demonstrate a range of media. This portfolio must include  • Six pieces of work in a clear folder (no larger than A1)  • Oversized works or sculptures should be photographed and included as one piece  • One piece may be a sketchbook	
What is involved in the selection process?	Our process looks beyond the finished piece - we want to see the thinking, creativity, and perseverance behind it.  Shortlisted candidates will:  Attend an assessment morning and an interview with the Head of Art.

Our Drama department is a vibrant and creative hub where individuality is celebrated, and students are encouraged to realise their full potential as performers and theatre-makers.

At Lingfield, Drama is about imagination, collaboration, and discovery. Students are supported to take risks, explore new techniques, and gain the confidence to express themselves on stage and behind the scenes. For Scholars, this means not only excelling in performance or technical theatre but also inspiring others through their creativity and commitment.

We seek students with strong dramatic ability, but equally the curiosity to try new approaches and the resilience to grow through feedback. Scholars are expected to contribute fully to school productions, support the wider dramatic life of the School, and act as role models to younger students.

The department is led by the Director of Drama, with two fully equipped studios and an Auditorium providing professional-standard performance spaces. Each year, we stage multiple productions, from Lower and Upper School plays to inviting professional touring theatre.

In our productions, students also take on key backstage roles - from stage management to lighting, sound and costume - ensuring Drama Scholars gain a broad and practical theatre education.

- A series of masterclasses, half-termly scholars' workshops and talks led by visiting performers and members of the Drama department.

Scholars receive one-to-one assistance with drama auditions, entry into drama competitions and advice on maintaining a balance between their subject and other activities.

- Invitations to participate in theatre trips, live performances and workshops to broaden their dramatic experience.

# Music Scholarship

Whether through solo performance, ensemble playing, or composition, our Scholars inspire, lead, and enrich the cultural life of the School."

Music plays a central role in school life at Lingfield. More than half of our students learn an instrument, and with over 16 ensembles and six major productions each year, there are opportunities for everyone to be involved.

We look for young musicians who show commitment, curiosity and a genuine enthusiasm for their subject. Our Scholars are expected to contribute fully to the musical life of the School, whether through ensembles, choirs or solo performance, and to set a positive example for others.

The department is led by the Director of Music and Assistant Director of Music, supported by around 20 visiting instrumental and vocal teachers. Together, they provide specialist tuition and guidance, helping each pupil to develop their skills and achieve their potential.

#### Our Facilities

The Music Department at Lingfield is exceptionally well-resourced and provides students with a professional and inspiring environment in which to learn, practise and perform.

- 8 dedicated practice rooms, each fully equipped to support instrumental and vocal lessons.
- Specialist teaching classrooms equipped with Mac computers and software for composition, recording, and music production.
- Specialist drum studio
- The school's auditorium houses a grand piano, alongside several upright pianos throughout the department.

These facilities support a packed and vibrant concert series each year, including solo recitals, ensemble concerts, large-scale stage productions, and music tours.

#### Programme Overview

Music Scholars receive tailored support and access to unique opportunities. We aim to nurture musical talent through expert tuition, diverse performance opportunities, and exposure to a wide range of musical experiences. We offer:

- High-quality teaching and facilities that enable every scholar to make significant improvements and development both technically and musically.
- A series of workshops and masterclasses led by professional musicians, composers and industry experts.
- Extensive performance opportunities, including a dedicated Music Scholars Concert, Classical, Rock and Jazz concerts, Musical Theatre evenings, and the chance to organise personal recitals.
- An Instrumental Mentor providing personalised guidance, access to additional resources, and support to help deepen musical interest and refine performance skills. Scholars receive oneto-one support with external auditions and music competitions.
- Listening and Analytical Programme Scholars are given a dedicated course and a variety of tasks to help widen the genres they listen to and develop their analytical skills and technical vocabulary.
   Every half-term, scholars are given a set list of pieces to listen to and asked to complete tasks and project work to show understanding.
- Invitations to participate in concert trips, workshops and musical theatre productions, enriching their musical education beyond the classroom.

- Lead by example through their musicianship and commitment to the Music Department.
- Maintain a balanced programme between their musical and academic studies.
- Earn the respect of their peers through their dedication, study and practice routines.
- Actively participate in the co-curricular music programme, setting an example to other students, demonstrating commitment, regular attendance and professional conduct at concerts and other events.
- Pass a Practical Grade exam each academic year in their chosen instrument, ideally
  achieving Merit or Distinction. Scholars may use any recognised exam board, but all must
  pass their ABRSM Grade 5 Theory exam by the end of Year 11, regardless of their
  instrument.

#### Programme Overview

Our Sports Scholarship programme is about more than performance. We look for athletes with passion, commitment and the drive to inspire others, supporting them with tailored coaching, mentoring and opportunities to excel while balancing academic progress. We offer:

- High-quality coaching, facilities and training programmes tailored to support athletic performance and development.
- Regular competitive fixtures and representation in school teams across multiple sports.
- Mentoring sessions with the Head of the Sport, including participation in specialist coaching sessions and tactical analysis to refine game understanding and strategy.
- Weekly Strength and Conditioning sessions designed to enhance physical performance and reduce injury risk.
- Regular feedback and an annual skills development report to track progress.
- Specialist workshops and talks from visiting experts, staff and alumni.
- Scholars Table A forum for meeting with senior sports staff to discuss development and the future of sport at Lingfield.
- Annual trip to Surrey Sports Park for fitness testing and performance analysis.
- Discounted access to professional physiotherapy services.

- Liaison with external clubs and coaches to support county, regional or national representation.
- Pre-season training and sports tours.

Sport is central to life at Lingfield. Students take part in multiple timetabled sports sessions each week, with additional training before and after school. Depending on their sport and the season, many athletes train several times per week, with our core sports of Football, Hockey, Netball and Cricket providing the foundation of the programme.

The Sport Department is staffed by a dedicated team of full-time teachers, alongside specialist coaches - many of whom have competed or coached at county, regional or national level. Our Heads of Sport lead coaching in their disciplines, supported by an in-house Head of Strength and Conditioning who develops bespoke programmes for students.

Competitive fixtures run across a wide range of sports and age groups, with many students going on to represent their county, region or even country. Sports tours are an integral part of our provision, offering unforgettable opportunities for team development and competing against top-level opposition.

# Scholarships Frequently Asked Questions

#### How do I apply for a Scholarship?

Simply complete the online application form on our website by the deadline. Please make sure you include all the required details and documents. External candidates will also need to be registered for the relevant Entrance Examinations (Year 7 in January, Year 9 in November). We can only consider complete applications that arrive on time.

#### Can I apply for more than one Scholarship?

Yes. Students can apply for multiple disciplines. Where more than one Scholarship/Award is granted, the total fee remission is capped at 20% in Senior School (Years 7–11) and 30% in Sixth Form (Years 12–13). Any further Scholarships are awarded on an honorary basis, recognising achievement but without additional fee remission.

# Do I need to sit an Entrance Examination for a Scholarship?

If you're applying from outside Lingfield, yes you'll need to take the appropriate Entrance Examinations and achieve a satisfactory score before we can consider you for a Scholarship.

## What happens if I am not awarded a Scholarship?

If a candidate shows real promise but doesn't quite meet the Scholarship standard, they may be offered an Award instead. Award holders are welcome to reapply for a Scholarship in later years.

# How do Scholarships and Financial Assistance work together?

Scholarships are awarded on merit, while Financial Assistance is means-tested. Families may apply for Financial Assistance if they successfully gain a Scholarship.

# When will I know the outcome of my application?

We'll be in touch as soon as possible after entrance exams and assessments are complete. Successful candidates will hear directly from the Admissions department.

### Do existing Scholarships continue into the Sixth Form?

All our scholarships are available through to Sixth Form, provided that the conditions set out in the Terms and Conditions are met. In some cases, this includes meeting specific entry requirements and/or choosing relevant GCSE or Sixth Form courses linked to the scholarship.

#### Can I change my Scholarship assessment dates?

We're not able to move assessment or audition dates, but if extreme weather makes travel unsafe, we have reserve dates in place.

### Do I have to take the subject at GCSE or A I evel?

In most cases, yes - you'll be expected to study the subject linked to your Scholarship at GCSE, and in some cases, A Level. Check the relevant discipline for this information. The exception is the Sport Scholarship.

# Can I apply for a Scholarship if I am already a Lingfield pupil?

Yes - you may apply in Year 6, 8 or Year 11 for entry into Years 7, 9 or 12, provided you meet the relevant criteria.

# Can I get feedback on my Scholarship application?

Regrettably, we are unable to offer personalised feedback on any Scholarship application or interview. Scholarships will be granted exclusively on the basis of merit and the performance demonstrated during the evaluation process. All decisions are final and based upon the Headmaster's discretion.

# What happens if a Scholar does not meet expectations?

The presumption is that Scholars will maintain their scholarships. In the rare event that the School has concerns about a student meeting their expectations, any related actions will only occur following appropriate discussions. Our priority remains to foster a supportive environment to help students achieve their fullest potential.

# Is a Sixth Form Academic scholarship conditional upon my GCSE results?

No. Scholarships are not awarded purely on GCSE outcomes. Instead, they are based on subject-specific strengths, academic potential, and intellectual curiosity. Applicants are expected to be typically aiming for top grades in their intended A Level or BTEC subjects or closely related fields.

#### What happens if I leave the School?

If a student leaves Lingfield at the end of Year II or earlier, repayment of any Scholarship or Award may be required. Please refer to the full Terms & Conditions for details.

#### Prep School - Senior School Transition

# Do Prep School Scholarships continue into Senior School?

Prep School Scholarships and Awards expire at the end of Year 8. Students wishing to hold a Senior School Scholarship from Year 9 onwards will need to apply again. Alternatively, they may apply for a Scholarship in Year 7, which, if successful, will supersede their Prep School Scholarship.

# What happens if my child has a Prep School Scholarship and applies for one at Year 7 but is unsuccessful?

Their Prep School Scholarship or Award will continue until the end of Year 8. They may then reapply in Year 8 for a Year 9 Scholarship.

# Can an Award at Year 7 be upgraded to a Scholarship later?

Yes. Students who hold an Award from Year 7 are welcome to apply again in Year 8 for a Year 9 Scholarship. If they are unsuccessful, the Award will continue.
